

A Smiling Jesus?

I was looking for a picture of Jesus on the internet related to a recent message. I remembered that there was one of a laughing or smiling Jesus, which got me to thinking. So many of the images we have of our Savior have been Americanized, meaning pale skin, blue eyes and a serious look. He might be carrying a lost sheep in his arms or praying in the garden or stilling a storm. But smiling? That would imply that he was having a good time and that he enjoyed being with others. For a public person who was able to perform healings, there were always people reaching out and begging or demanding a miracle cure.

We know that Jesus enjoyed his "time out" moments with Mary and Martha, even when they were squabbling. There were the twelve disciples who not only were frustrating to him, but likely created smiles when they messed up. "Sure Peter, step out on the water," and then he sunk like a rock. Although the Lord directed all his disciples to take a step in faith, he likely smiled at their toddler-like stumbling. One day they would "walk by faith and not just by sight." And Jesus would smile at how far they had come in their discipleship.

I suspect Jesus smiles at us also in our feeble attempts to do well or to be found faithful. He likely weeps with us also when life throws us a curve. Overall we can be comforted knowing that our God tunes into our emotions, our joys, our pains, worries and celebrations.

In one picture I viewed of a smiling Jesus, was his warm, embracing welcome as we entered heaven. That's what I would hope for. I wouldn't want to meet the Lord when he had a questioning or hard look like "how did you get here?" "Why should I welcome you to my Father's household?" That's when a smile would come across my face. "I'm here in heaven because of you." It would not be because of my weak attempts to prove my worth, it would be because of Christ's sacrifice. And then I would begin to hum the children's tune, "Jesus loves me, this I know..."

Next time you think of Jesus, you may think of him as all serious or in agony. But don't forget that he also can smile. Happy Easter!
